23-26 June 2004. International Workshop on “Ecosystem Research in the Arid Environments of Central Asia: Results, Challenges and Perspectives” in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. The meeting is a part of the Mongolian-German science cooperation, and will be organized jointly by the Faculty of Biology, National University of Mongolia, the Faculty of Biology, University of Halle, Germany and the Faculty of Geography, University of Marburg, Germany. The workshop will be held at the National University of Mongolia, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. The aims of the workshop are twofold. First is an overall assessment of recent research project carried out in the Gobi Gurvan Saikhan Nature Reserve in the Mongolian Gobi. The second aim will be related to the current research in other Central Asian ecosystems, and the contributions should demonstrate the importance of basic ecological research for sustainable resource management and nature conservation. Conference language is English. After the workshop, participants are invited to join the post-symposium excursion to the Gobi Gurvan Saikhan Research Station in Southern Mongolia. The tour will take a total five days (between 26 June and 1 July), and offers opportunities for on site discussions of the conference topics.
